

# Harrogate Deanery Synod 11<sup>th</sup> July 2023

**Welcome** The meeting was opened by the Chair, the Revd Dr Alan Garrow, Harrogate Area Dean, who welcomed everyone to St Peter's Church and to the first synod of the new Triennium (2023 – 2026)

### Deanery Synod Elections - House of Laity only

• The Area Dean informed the Laity synod members that Dr Sue Atkin, from St Mark's Church, had expressed a willingness to stand as the new Lay Chair. The Area Dean explained that Sue has had several years' valuable experience being a member of the General Synod, being Lay Chair of Chelmsford Diocesan Synod, and being a member of the Chelmsford Cathedral Chapter. The Area Dean asked members if they wished to accept the nomination. The nomination was accepted with a resounding round of applause.

## **Deanery Synod Elections – Joint synod**

- **Deanery Synod Treasurer.** The Area Dean, informed that Mr Iain Ward-Campbell, had agreed to continue in the role of Treasurer and the nomination was readily accepted with a cheerful 'Hurrah'!
- Deanery Synod Secretary. The Area Dean, informed that Miss Helen Camm, had expressed
  a willingness to continue as Secretary, and the nomination was wholeheartedly accepted.
  The Area Dean explained that the Deanery is here to provide support, and respectfully asked
  members to respond to emails sent by the Secretary, so that information can be gathered,
  and decisions made in a timely fashion.
- Joint Standing Committee. The Area Dean informed that Harrogate Joint Standing Committee is not involved in making decisions on how money is spent; its focus is on deciding what topics and issues should be presented and debated at each synod. In addition to the Area Dean (Chair), the Assistant Area Dean, the Lay Chair, the Deanery Synod

Treasurer and the Deanery Synod Secretary, the following people expressed a willingness to join the Joint Standing Committee and were very warmly welcomed as new members.

- The Revd Mike Resch informed the Secretary via email that she had forgotten to mention that St Mark's had been selected by the Church of England to be a Minster Church for Children and Young People's ministry. The Secretary apologised and a new paragraph has been added in the 'Good News from the Deanery' section to provide more detail on this matter (Page 2).
- Mrs Moira Keith sent an email clarifying some the points she made regarding the work done
  with children, young people, and families during the pandemic in the Lower Wharfedale
  Benefice (Page 8).

These amendments have been made and the minutes signed by the Area Dean, Chair.

The Area Dean made a connection between the filling meal we share now and the heavenly banquet for which we long – a foretaste of which we experience in the Eucharist.


#### **Celebration of the Eucharist**
